Every purchase made in the gift shop benefits the programs and services that Williamson Health provides to the community. Your recent purchases have enabled the Volunteer Auxiliary of The Williamson Health Foundation to provide items such as vein finders for our patients in PEDS, mannequins for CPR training, Recumbent Bike and Cross Trainer for our Cardiac Rehab department, and more. We made remarkable progress in our historic renovation and expansion of Williamson Health facilities this year.

- » Completing the expansion of the obstetrics wing
- » Opening a new neonatal intensive care unit (NICU)
- » Opening the new Boyer-Bryan West Tower at Williamson Medical Center
- » Opening the new Cardiac Center

ELEVATING EXCELLENCE



To celebrate the opening of our newly expanded Boyer-Bryan West Tower in June, Williamson Health hosted a free community event with family-friendly entertainment, activities, food, and more. The Boyer-Bryan West Tower includes three new floors and houses labor and delivery, NICU, surgery, ICU and cardiology services.

In a small ceremony prior to the ribbon cutting, we unveiled a sign dedicating the building as the Boyer-Bryan West Tower on behalf of hospital supporters Luke and Caroline (Boyer) Bryan and The Brett Boyer Foundation. The ribbon-cutting featured appearances from supporters Luke Bryan and Caroline (Boyer) Bryan as well as Ellen and Bo Boyer.

The Boyer-Bryan West Tower now includes a 35-bed ICU for critical care needs, 94 medical-surgical inpatient rooms, 33 obstetrics rooms, 10 pediatric inpatient rooms, and more. The world-class Cardiac Center has also been expanded and updated to include two state-of-the-art cardiac catheterization labs and a brand-new electrophysiology lab.

The masquerade event is Bone and Joint Institute’s primary fundraiser and benefits the Williamson Health athletic training program and scholarships for students who will be pursuing health science degrees in college. Attendees can enjoy a black-tie experience complete with dinner, drinks, a silent auction and dancing, featuring the dynamic band Burning Las Vegas.

Throughout the year, Williamson Health athletic trainers work in tandem with dedicated Bone and Joint Institute physicians to care for Williamson County Schools student-athletes. In addition to the Williamson Health athletic trainers and Bone and Joint Institute team physicians, crews from Williamson Health Emergency Medical Services (EMS) are on the sidelines during football games and other events, ready to provide immediate care in case of injury. This event raised \$27,435.

One of the primary beneficiaries of the Skeleton Gala is the Craig Ferrell Memorial Scholarship Fund. Named in honor of the late Dr. Ferrell, these scholarships are given to Williamson County high school students who are pursuing a college degree in health sciences.

We understand there are many mental, emotional and physical challenges that accompany breast cancer. Post-surgery healing shouldn't be one of them! We partner with women recovering from surgery by offering a free 4-week reservation of a recliner, so they can recover more comfortably while gaining their strength back after surgery. Patients just have to reserve their chair, and it will be delivered, sanitized and placed wherever they would like in their home for four weeks.

We were able to provide 40 chairs for women recovering from breast cancer surgery this year.

Our community partner Head Springs Depot, a Franklin, TN furniture store, is partnering with the Foundation to store, sanitize and deliver recliner chairs for the complimentary 4-week program. We are immensely grateful for their support.

RACHEL'S PINK CHAIR STORY

When I was diagnosed with breast cancer, it was shocking and came with an overwhelming amount of information. On my initial visit with the Williamson Health breast cancer navigator, I was told about Operation Pink Chairs. Since I still had testing and scans to complete before surgery, I didn't pay much attention to it until I was told that I would need to be in an elevated position on my back for six weeks to sleep. Then the lightbulb went off. A few of my other friends who didn't know about the program because they went to other medical facilities for treatment of their breast cancer were amazed.

I contacted Operation Pink Chairs and it was easy to select a drop off date with Head Springs Depot. The guys were super

helpful and wished me luck with surgery. Having the ease of an electric recliner for recovering was unbelievably helpful to me. It kept me comfortable and safe during that time.

Also, the comfort I felt inside knowing that there is such a caring community support group that would do this for me without even knowing me was unexpected. It was like a warm blanket. I am so grateful to Operation Pink Chairs and the Williamson Health Foundation. It meant so much to my husband and I during a scary time of healing that we will continue to support other breast cancer patients who can benefit from this great program with our donations.

With organized communication day in and day out, our teams continually collaborate on return-to-play protocols for injured student-athletes to ensure the best and safest pathway forward to successful careers.
